

# Exploring THE Great Ocean Drive

- 1 Cannery Arts Centre & Lookout  
A vibrant community arts centre that facilitates exhibitions and workshops. Climb the stairs at the rear of the Cannery for a view of the Esperance Bay.
- 2 Jetty Headland - 300m  
With a nature playground, food and coffee vans plus beautiful walkways, theres plenty to do at the Jetty Headland. It also offers BBQs, restrooms and showers for public use.
- 3 James Street Precinct - 1.4 km  
Home to the unique Whale Tail sculpture. An abilities playground, swimming pontoon, restrooms and BBQs make this is a fantastic picnic spot.
- 4 Taylor Street Jetty - 2 km  
Jump in for a swim, take a walk through the Don McKenzie Gardens, meander along the Yacht Club Marina or throw a fishing line in off the Jetty.
- 5 Southern Ports - 2.4 km  
A viewing area of the Port and access to a sheltered beach. *Port Tours held every Saturday at 1:30pm from the Port viewing area. (Donation appreciated)*
- 6 Rotary Lookout & Walk trail - 3.1 km  
Boasting a 360° view of the town and archipelago makes this a wonderful spot to watch the sunset. There are two trails winding around Dempster Head with spectacular views of the crystal blue waters.
- 7 Lovers Cove - 3.7 km  
Hidden away along the Rotary Walk Trail, which begins at the Rotary Lookout. It's a sweet little cove that's protected from the wind and swell.

- 8 West Beach - 3.9 km  
Great to swim, surf and relax. West beach has two large reefs which create natural ocean pools. Strong currents and permanent rips at this beach mean you need to be aware of your surroundings.
- 9 Chapmans Point - 5.1 km  
An excellent surf break and can also perfect for snorkelling and swimming on a calm day.
- 10 Blue Haven - 6.7 km  
A protected beach when a strong southerly is blowing. It's a popular destination for families with minimal swell.
- 11 Salmon Beach - 7.2 km  
On a calm day it's excellent for snorkelling and a great spot to fish from the beach.
- 12 Fourth Beach - 9.5 km  
Fourth Beach is a long stretch of sand that leads to Twilight Cove. Popular for all types of surfing and swimming too. There are four access points along Twilight Beach Road.
- 13 Twilight Cove - 11.1 km  
One of Esperance's most famous beaches, Twilight is patrolled on Sundays over Summer and a great spot to kick back and relax.
- 14 Dolphin Cove - 11.3 km  
Dolphin Cove is accessible from the same car park as Twilight. Perfect for exploring and if you're lucky you might glimpse some dolphins in the surf.
- 15 Observatory Point - 15.5 km  
The lookout at this beautiful spot is popular for catching a glimpse of whales in season. Venture down the many steps and enjoy the protected beach.
- 16 Observatory Beach - 15.6 km  
Make the journey down the steps and check out this expansive beach. Great for windsurfing.



- 17 Nine Mile Beach - 16.5 km  
An explorers' delight! Wander through the rock pools to discover a protected lagoon perfect for snorkelling.
- 18 Ten Mile Windfarm - 20 km  
Discover the history of the Esperance Windfarm. A short walk past the first windmill will yield stunning views of the windfarm and ocean.
- 19 Ten Mile Lagoon - 19 km  
Great for swimming and fishing, this beach is also the access point to 'Free Beach' where clothing is optional.
- 20 Eleven Mile Beach - 21 km  
Perfect for a swim in the calm lagoon or a wander through the rock pools.
- 21 Pink Lake Lookout  
Our once pink, Pink Lake is an lovely place to watch the sunset. Information on the lake's history and why it is no longer pink is available on site.
